Global Awareness

Girl Scouting goes beyond our council and even Girl Scouts of the USA. There are Girl Scouts all over the world, often known as Girl Guides. Girl Scouts of the USA is a member of the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS). This organization includes over 10 million girls in 150 countries! Together, we are working to make the world a better place and create female leaders. Learn more about global awareness with these activities.

1. World Thinking Day
 - With the help of an adult, go to [girlscouts.org/worldthinkingday](https://www.girlscouts.org/worldthinkingday) to find out about this year's World Thinking Day theme. World Thinking Day is celebrated in February every year, but you can complete the award at any time. Choose one activity that you think would be fun from the World Thinking Day Award and list it here:

 - Who or what do Girl Scouts “think” about when we celebrate World Thinking Day?
2. Choose one or more:
 - With the help of an adult, learn about and discuss what the U.N. sustainability goals are. Which of these goals are important to you?
 - Attend or participate in a World Thinking Day event. What is something interesting you learned?
 - Earn one of the following badges, petals, or Journeys:
 - ★ Daisy: Respect Myself and Others or Good Neighbor
 - ★ Brownie: Girl Scout Way or Celebrating Community or World of Girl Journey

Step 2

Global Citizen

You don't have to travel to be a global Girl Scout. Being global means experiencing other cultures, celebrating diversity, and being open to new ideas. The Girl Guide and Girl Scout Movement have always been global in nature. Learn how to be a global citizen by completing the following activities:

1. Global Action Days

2. Choose one or more:

- Pick a country you are interested in learning more about. Look at art, read a book, make a traditional dish, or listen to music from that country.
- With the help of an adult, go online to find out about Juliette Gordon Low and learn about how Girl Guides inspired her to create the Girl Scout program.
- With an adult, go to girlscouts.org/globalactionaward. Learn about this year's Global Action Award for your level, and complete one step towards earning the award.

Step 3

Ready. Set.

Now that you are learning about the world around you, learn how to explore it for yourself. Anytime you explore the world around you it counts as traveling—even if it's to the next town over! This section will lead you to the next step in Girl Scouting and becoming a confident traveler.

1. Travel Plans

- With the help of an adult, visit our council's Activity List at gswpa.org/activities. What are some of the places you can travel to with Girl Scouts? Travel doesn't have to be far away. A trip to the local zoo or a nearby state park is a travel experience!

- How can the MagNut and Girl Scout Cookie programs and council resources help you travel?

2. Choose one or more:

- With an adult, go online to take a virtual tour of the United Nations at un.org. What is the United Nations and how many members does it have?
- Make a list of three places you'd like to go at some point in your life. Learn a fun fact about one of them.

Step 4 Go!

Travel can mean many different things. It can be a visit to a local museum or pumpkin patch or an overnight outing at camp. As you continue in your Girl Scout experience, you will have new travel opportunities which may take you out of our state and even our country! Girl Scout travel progresses as you get older. In this activity, you will learn about and prepare for future travel.

1. Choose one or more:

- Interview an older Girl Scout about their travel experience.
- Visit an older Girl Scout troop during a campout. Unsure of where to start? Check with your service unit for ideas.
- Earn the Girl Scout Safety Award for your level.
