Knot tying is not only fun but can be helpful in your everyday life. There are lots of great reasons to learn knot tying.

There are practical reasons, such as tying your shoes, securing items, or even a DIY leash for your dog. No matter what your situation, knot-tying is one sure way to "be prepared," which is the Girl Scout motto!

There are also artistic reasons to learn knot tying such as making jewelry or trying macramé! Even sewing requires a basic understanding of knot tying. Tying knots can be beautiful and stylish, too!

There are reasons to learn how to tie knots for sports too. Sailing on a boat, for example, requires lots of knot tying know-how. For a rock climber or a spelunker, it can mean the difference between life and death. And you might want to double knot those laces before you head out onto the field!

Not only is it practical, but tying knots is good for you! Knot tying improves finger dexterity (the measurement of a person's ability to handle small objects or to manipulate controls using their fingers) and mental agility (the ability of an individual to think, learn, and quickly absorb new information, systems, and processes). Training your fingers to hold the rope and make the knots is a real workout!

Discover the basics of knot tying.


- 1. List three ways you use knots in everyday life.
