

## Roles and Responsibilities in Governance and Management

Governance/policy decisions are the responsibility of the Board of Directors.

Management /operational decisions are the responsibility of the Chief Executive Officer. Input and suggestions on management should be made through operational staff and the Chief Executive Officer.

As a Council Delegate, your responsibility is in governance: to provide feedback on policies, vote to adopt council bylaws and on Board of Director nominations. You also take information back to your service unit about council goals, fund development campaigns, and council business that is announced at Annual Meeting and Town Halls.

The chart below gives specific examples of governance and management responsibilities.
