Before You Takeoff

- ☐ Register as a volunteer.
- □ Complete <u>required clearances</u>.
- □ Connect with your membership engagement specialist. They can help you find a co-leader, set up your troop, recruit girls to your troop, and even find a meeting space. Need help connecting? Contact customer care at customercare@gswpa.org or 800-248-3355.
- \square Review the <u>troop leader role</u>.
- ☐ Invite girls to join the troop. You'll need five girls to launch your troop.
- ☐ Complete your training in gsLearn. An email will be sent to you by the new troop leader coordinator within seven days after being approved as a troop leader. This email will include instructions on how to start.

Launching Your Troop: The First 30 Days

- ☐ Welcome new girls and their families as they register:
 - a. Your troop will remain open on the Opportunity Catalog for new girls to join until you reach 12 girls (standard troop size). Interested in more girls? Complete our <u>Troop Catalog Update Form</u>.
 - b. Need help with recruitment? <u>Let us know</u>, and your membership engagement specialist can support you.
- ☐ Review the *Leaders Guide to Success*.
- ☐ Check out the Volunteer Toolkit, a customizable planning tool for your troop. You'll find the Volunteer Toolkit via the left menu bar of MyGS in My Account. It's accessible on any desktop, tablet, or mobile device.
- ☐ Connect with your service unit to find out about meetings for leaders and events in your local community.
- ☐ Attend a required Expore Your Year session within three months of your onboarding as a new leader.
- ☐ Come to our <u>Volunteer Open House</u>, an optional opportunity to talk about relevant council topics, volunteer topics, and more.

- □ Submit an <u>Annual Finance Report</u>, due yearly on June 15.
- \square Let your girls guide you to the additional trainings you will take:
 - a. Let's Go Travel (located in gsLearn)
 - b. <u>First Aid/CPR/AED</u> (recommended for meetings, required for trips and high adventure activities)
 - c. Let's Go Camping (for overnights and camping activities)
- ☐ Troops will participate in and learn about our product programs: the <u>MagNut program</u> and the Girl Scout Cookie Program.
- ☐ Learn about Girl Scout traditions.
- ☐ Check out additional <u>volunteer resources</u> available to you at gswpa.org.
